- Nightly curfew 10:00 PM or 1 hour after show ends

## 2020 Shelby County Junior Fair Events FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### Vouchers

- Will vouchers still be printed and distributed?
  - Yes.
- What will the hours be to cash them?
  - One hour after the judging starts until one hour after the judging is completed.
- Will consideration be given to cashing vouchers during pre-fair judging each day so those exhibitors do not have to come back on to the grounds during fair week events?
  - Yes, we will cash vouchers during pre-fair judging this year. Details will be provided at pre-fair judging.

### Admission/Spectators

- Will gate admission be charged to attend Junior Fair events?
  - No.
- How will admission work?
  - Each household, as defined in the White Pages, will get bands to distribute to spectators of their choosing to enter on the day that they show. For example, if a family has one child that shows rabbits (Thursday) and another child that shows swine (Wednesday), they will get bands to enter both Wednesday and Thursday's events, but they will not get bands to enter the grounds on other days that they do not have a judging event. Exhibitors and 4-H/FFA advisors will still get photo IDs to get into the gate for all event days.
  - The number of bands distributed per household will be individually determined per conversations between advisors and families (advisors will receive details about band distribution by July 1). Junior Fair Board simply requests that families carefully consider who is most important to be in attendance as a spectator and that families keep in mind that limiting spectator numbers is necessary to abide by local health department and sector-specific guidelines. The ultimate goal of the bands is to prevent individuals coming into the gate who are not affiliated in any way with a Junior Fair exhibitor.
- What time can people arrive? What time must they leave?
  - Arrival times for each event are listed in the schedule table. The fairgrounds has set a nightly curfew, enforced by the Shelby County Sheriff's Department, of 10 pm OR one hour after the end of the last show, whichever is later.
- Where can they park? What gate(s) do they enter?
  - Parking on the grounds will be free and first-come, first-serve. Please enter the fairgrounds using the Highland Avenue gate which sits on the east side of the grounds between the Beige Building and the Secretary's Office.

- Can they sit in bleachers? Can they enter the barns?
  - Yes and yes. Please limit gatherings to 10, social distance when applicable and enter the barns only when necessary.
- Will there be concessions on the grounds?
  - Yes.

### **Check-In/Release Times**

- What will the expectation be for traffic flow? Loading and unloading?
  - Please enter the fairgrounds using the Highland Avenue gate which sits on the east side of the grounds between the Beige Building and the Secretary's Office. Please exit the fairgrounds using the Emerson Elementary gate at the northwest corner of the fairgrounds.
  - For loading and unloading (short-term parking), please use courtesy in where you temporarily park trucks and trailers. Make sure they off to the side and out of the right-of-way. Avoid blocking hydrants and fire lanes.
  - Long-term parking will be found in the usual parking and camping areas of the ground.
- Can families bring tack in early as they have in the past?
  - No.
- Can stalls/pens be bedded? What is the expectation for cleaning before leaving?
  - Yes, pens and stalls can be bedding. Whatever is brought in must be taken out by exhibitor before leaving.
- How will declared weights work for hogs?
  - Guidelines are currently being drafted and will be shared with exhibitors ASAP.
- Are we tagging market goats and lambs at all or just using scrapie tags?
  - We will just be using scrapie tags this year.
- Are we tagging feeder calves and swine?
  - Yes, sale committee intends to tag both species at fair during check-in.
- When/how will JFB confirm that the animal being checked-in is the one identified during virtual spring check-ins (photos via FairEntry)?
  - Guidelines are currently being drafted and will be shared with exhibitors ASAP.
- When will JFB do hair checks for hogs?
  - During tagging at the pens.
- Will pens/stalls be assigned or will they be first-come, first-serve?
  - Yes, pens and stalls will still be assigned.

- Will poultry and rabbit pens be set up?
  - Cages will not be pre-set-up. However, they will be available for use and must be cleaned and returned if used.
- Can people show off trailers? Can they pen/stall?
  - It will be up to each family whether they use the pen/stall assigned to them or not. Junior Fair Board will likely send out a survey closer to fair to determine who plans to use their pen/stall and who plans to show off the trailer.
- When will block trucks come in for market species?
  - Block trucks will be scheduled to come in each day at the end of the market shows.
- How will champion animals be handled?
  - Junior Fair events will remain partial-terminal (per ODA) and all grand and reserve champion market animals (as listed in the White Pages) will go out after each show for slaughter.

#### **Back Numbers, Programs, Sale, Awards, etc.**

- Will we be using back numbers this year?
  - Yes.
- Will we be printing show programs?
  - No. Class lists/virtual programs will be accessible in the 4-H Now app.
- Will there be a sale?
  - Yes. The sale will be online this year. Details are being worked on by the Livestock Sale Committee and will be shared ASAP.

- Are we going to pass out awards in the ring as we always have?
  - Yes, while following appropriate sanitation and social distancing guidelines.
- Where do we expect/anticipate people hanging out between classes and events? Can they set up 10x10 tents?
  - Yes, pop-up tents can be set-up as long as they appropriately distanced and staked for safety.

### **Miscellaneous Questions**

- Will there still be peewee showmanship (swine and goats/lambs)?
  - No.
- Will non-livestock kids be expected to exhibit their project on the grounds (traditionally in 4-H booths) to get their vouchers?
  - No.
- When and where will Junior Fair Board elections be held?
  - Daily from 12 to 4 pm at the temporary Junior Fair Board Headquarters (Ferguson Construction Office Trailer)
- Will shows be livestreams?
  - YES! We are excited to be able to livestream a majority of our events this year. Details coming soon.
- Will the newspaper be coming to do pictures for award winners? If so, what days and hours?
  - Yes, they will be coming. Dates and times TBA.
- Will the milk house be open for dairy cattle?
  - No
- Will emergency services be on site in case of injury/illness
  - Yes
- Will there still be pre-fair judging for non-livestock projects?
  - Yes and pre-fair will follow the original schedule. There will be some slight modifications to how judging takes place, which will be sent to exhibitors by July 1. Changes include:
    - Judging will be held in the Beige Building
    - Foods exhibitors will not bring food samples this year
    - No woodworking skillathon
    - No OSF qualifiers (due to the cancellation of OSF)
    - Virtual option for those not comfortable attending in-person judging
