ATTENTION ALL EXHIBITORS 2021 Updates for the Ractopamine Free Ohio State Fair.

- We will be a ractopamine free fair.
- Exhibitor Affidavit for the Market Barrow Show will be required
- Market Barrows will be required to have an 840 Tag. We prefer that they be the EID (Electronic Identification) 840 Tags but will accept non EID this year. These should be placed in the pig from the breeder they originate from, if possible please have them placed in the RIGHT EAR. If you do not have one, you will want to work with your local vet.
- All Market Exhibitors will be required to enter parent/guardian PQA Certification ID# at the time of entry.
- All swine must be tagged with an 840 tag.
- **All exhibitors must have a premise ID** (this is based on the location the pigs were raised, so the same premise ID will cover all siblings). Please go to <https://agri.ohio.gov/wps/portal/gov/oda/divisions/animal-health/animal+id/premise-registration-form-fillable> 840 tags or getting a premise ID, please talk to your veterinarian.

EXHIBITING A RACTOPAMINE-FREE SWINE PROJECT

RACTOPAMINE-FREE SWINE PRODUCTION IS NOW A MARKET SPECIFICATION/REQUIREMENT THROUGHOUT MUCH OF THE U.S. PORK PACKING INDUSTRY. BECAUSE SHOW PIGS HAVE THE POTENTIAL TO ENTER INTERNATIONAL PORK MARKETS, THEY MUST BE RACTOPAMINE-FREE.

EXPECT YOUR FAIR TO SECURE A SIGNED AFFIDAVIT FROM A PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN STATING THAT THE PIGS EXHIBITED BY THEIR SHOWMAN HAVE NEVER BEEN OFFERED RACTOPAMINE.



WHAT IS RACTOPAMINE?

A beta-adrenergic agonist that when fed according to label directions can improve pig growth rate, carcass composition, and feed conversion efficiency. Product trade names include: Paylean®, Optaflexx®, Engain®, Actogain®, and other generic derivatives.



WHAT DOES RACTOPAMINE-FREE MEAN?

The pig has never been fed or exposed to ractopamine sources from the time of birth to the time of harvest.



AREAS OF FOCUS TO ENSURE YOUR PROJECT IS RACTOPAMINE-FREE

1. YOUR PIG

Understand the status of any pig(s) you purchase or raise on your own farm and comply by not feeding or exposing your pigs to ractopamine.

2. YOUR FEED SUPPLY

Work directly with your feed supplier to assure that the feed you use is free of ractopamine.

3. YOUR FEEDERS

Feeders and containers should be thoroughly disinfected and dried prior to adding new feed. This will prevent cross-contamination.

4. YOUR BARN

Pens, bedding, fans, etc. should be thoroughly disinfected as they have a risk of containing ractopamine if you have fed it in the past.

5. YOUR TRAILER

Do a complete disinfection and drying of trailers and vehicles between loads of pigs.

6. EXHIBITION

Don't offer ractopamine if the rules indicate it is not acceptable for the fair or exhibition.

OUTSTANDING BREEDING EXHIBITOR

Youth Reserve Program awards will be announced at a later date.

Fourth through tenth places for the Outstanding Breeding Exhibitor will be sponsored by the Ohio Swine Youth Committee. The non-profit Ohio Swine Youth Committee is a support group for swine shows at the Ohio State Fair. Proceeds are generated from sponsorships of swine shows, the Ohio Crossbred Classic, and the Ohio Youth Gilt Show.

SESSION 1 and 2 INFORMATION

BREEDING SWINE ENTERING PROCEDURE

- Ownership deadline: Breeding Swine - June 1.
- **Entries close on June 20.** All entries must be done on-line through www.ohiostatefair.com. Exhibitors should retain a record of their exact login information (username and password).
 - If entering under farm name, please utilize team/ company information line to list your farm name.
 - Entries must include exhibitors name, complete address, and entry fees.
 - Exhibitors should retain a record of their exact login information (username and password) for use in future years.
- Entries close on June 20. **No Late Jr Breeding Swine entries.**
- Entry Fee for Junior Breeding Swine is \$25 per head
- Online entries must include FFA Advisor or 4H County Extension Professional information. Junior Exhibitor's entries will not be finalized until the confirmation is received back from either the FFA Advisor or 4H County Extension Professional. This takes the place of the signature that was required on the paper entry form.
- Breeding gilt entries must include Breed and session number. Each animal needs registration number, sire, sire of dam, ear notch and birthdate entered at the time of online entry.
- Registration papers for all purebred gilts are required. (See Ownership Guidelines for more details). Registration information is required AT THE TIME OF ENTRY. It includes Registration number, breed, donor or bred and owned, gender, sire, sire of dam, birthdate and ear notch. A fine of \$10 per head will be charged at time of check-in for failure to provide ahead of time.
- Registration papers must be presented at the time of check-in. Originals required. No copies accepted.
- All breeding swine must be ear notched. Registration papers will be checked with ear notches of animals before animals can be shown.
- If entering both Junior and Open, you MUST complete entry online for BOTH JR and OPEN (both are online only).

- TICKETING AND PARKING INFORMATION - There will be no admission charge in 2021. Parking will be charged. The cost for parking is \$50 for 6 days and \$75 for the full run of the event. There is no pre-purchase available for parking.

Session 1 & 2 BREEDING SWINE OWNERSHIP AND AGE GUIDELINES

- All animals exhibited must have been actually owned and continuously cared for by the individual exhibitor including all showing rights by June 1.
- Ownership of an animal will be considered lost if, after June 1 of current year, the animal has been consigned or sold through an auction or any other type transaction, even if the exhibitor “buys back” his animal.
- All Breeding Gilts must have been farrowed on or after December 1, 2020. Breeding gilt classes will be shown by age; youngest to oldest.

EXHIBITION

- Pen assignment request will be taken starting Sunday, July 25th Tickets for your spot in line can be picked up beginning at 8am on Sunday, July 25 at the Ohio State Fair Swine Barn Office. **NO BARN LINES. We are working on an online system, if available prior to fair, information will be sent to all exhibitors via email used in online entry.**
- All pens are assigned by the Swine Department personnel. Exhibitors must check for correct pen assignments before bedding down. Exhibits incorrectly located will need to move to assigned area. If exhibitor fails to follow pen assignments, they will be asked to leave.
- Pen space limited to pigs only. NO TACK or FEED in pens. Boards may be put across the top of pens for tack and feed storage. Pens are approximately 5' x 7'.
- Each exhibitor must furnish his own feed troughs, buckets, etc. Feed and bedding will not be furnished, but will be available for purchase. Feed Store- 614-989-3343
- Exhibitors should arrange to feed their animals between 6:00 am - 8:00 am and 5:00 pm - 7:00 pm

The Ohio State Fair will follow the Ohio Department of Agriculture Livestock Exhibition Rules.

- No oil or oil-like show dressing will be permitted at the Ohio State Fair during the show. **Water is the preferred and accepted dressing**
- Powder and whitewash will not be allowed on Chester White, Landrace and Yorkshire,
- Poland China will not be permitted to use paint, powder or oil at the Ohio State Fair.
- The use of the above will result in forfeiture of premiums.
- Any breed failing to exhibit a total of 15 animals in the breeding classes will be cause for evaluation of continuing this breed in future shows.

AWARDS

Animals in each class will be placed on a 1-2-3-4 etc. basis and the premiums as listed will be paid on the numerical placing. The placing premiums will be determined at the conclusion of the show.

- Classes will be divided by a maximum of 7 head per class, plus or minus 3. The Youth Reserve premium money is based on number of exhibitors at the 2019 Ohio State Fair.

- A Champion and Reserve Supreme Gilt and Top 5 will be chosen from ALL GRAND & RESERVE BREED CHAMPIONS ON SATURDAY, JULY 31st AT TBD- GRAND BREEDING DRIVE.
- Champions and Reserves from Session One will need to meet with Directors for details about the Grand Drive.
 - Ohio State Fair Supreme Champion Breeding Gilt- Youth Reserve Program awards will be announced at a later date.
 - Ohio State Fair Supreme Reserve Champion Breeding Gilt- Youth Reserve Program awards will be announced at a later date.
- Ohio Youth Swine Committee will provide additional awards at Grand Drive to the Top 10.

BRED AND OWNED

- Bred and Owned classes will be for the junior gilt show only at the Ohio State Fair for the following breeds:
 - Hampshire & Landrace
- To be eligible for Bred and Owned:
 - Exhibitors *MUST* declare that his or her gilt is eligible for the bred and owned division at time of providing registration information and again in confirming at check-in.
 - All gilts *MUST* be owned by the exhibitor. The exhibitors' first and last name must be listed on the pedigree as *BOTH* the owners and breeder to be eligible for the Bred and Owned. There may be multiple names listed, as long as the additional names are under the age of 21 and from the same residence. Farm names will be accepted. However, anyone listed under the farm name that is over 21 and not from the same residence will *NOT* be accepted.
- Bred and owned gilts will show in their respective regular classes. There will not be a separate class for the Bred and Owned Division. For the selection of the Champion and Reserve Champion gilt, only the first and second place Bred and Owned gilts in each class are eligible to return for the Bred and Owned championship drive.
- Awards will be given to the top two Bred and Owned gilts in each class. Top 5 Overall Bred and Owned will be placed. Premiums and awards will be announced at a later date.

- All swine must be tagged with an 840 tag. **All exhibitors must have a premise ID** (this is based on the location the pigs were raised, so the same premise ID will cover all siblings). Please go to <https://agri.ohio.gov/wps/portal/gov/oda/divisions/animal-health/animal%20id/premise-registration-form-fillable> to register for a premise id. Don't delay as this can take a few weeks to get. If you have any questions on 840 tags or getting a premise ID, please talk to your veterinarian.
- All barrows NOT IN GRAND DRIVE are released after the show on Friday, August 6th. Releases will be available at conclusion of the show. All champion and reserve barrows not named Overall Grand and Reserve must be removed by 10 pm on Saturday, August 7th.

SESSION 3 JUNIOR MARKET BARROW ENTERING PROCEDURE

- Ownership deadline: May 26 All animals must be owned by and in the care of the exhibitor by May 26.

BARROW ENTERING PROCEDURE

- **ALL BARROWS** must be entered online. **Entry deadline is June 20. NO late entry for barrows will be accepted.**
- **ALL barrows** MUST enter into Division 511. This year you will be entering into specific classes by Breed. Other information that will need provided is the 840 Tag ID#, ear notch, Sire, Sire of the Dam, registration number if purebred, and declaring/acknowledging your barrow had been and will be ractopamine free.
- Any other potential barrows MUST be entered by June 20 into class 002, without charge. If NOT entered under that individual exhibitor, not eligible to show.
- Upon arrival at the Ohio State Fair exhibitor MUST declare which barrow(s) will be shown. The entry/entries **MUST** be confirmed by the Ohio State Fair staff at check-in using the original entry list to confirm. If barrow identification does NOT match original entry information, entry will not be eligible for show.
- All Registration papers for purebred barrows will be collected at check-in. **WEIGHTS WILL BE DECLARED** within 2 hours of check-in up to 7 PM. Any barrows arriving at the end of check-in will be required to declare weights at that time.
- Please go to www.ohiostatefair.com to enter online. Exhibitors should retain a record of their exact login information (username and password) for use in future years.
 - All entries must include exhibitors name, complete address, and entry fees.
 - Entry fee for Junior Barrows is \$25 per head
 - 4H/FFA Members must be registered for the project through their county extension office or FFA Chapter. If you are exhibiting a Market Barrow, you must be registered for the 4H/FFA Market Swine project, in your county, even if your county does not exhibit at a local level.
 - Online entries must include FFA Advisor or 4H County Extension Professional information. Junior Exhibitor's entries will not be finalized until the confirmation is received back from either the FFA Advisor or 4H County Extension Professional. This takes the place of the signature required on the paper entry form.
- Registration papers for all purebred barrows are required. Registration information is required at the time of online entry. Registration papers must be presented at the time of check-in. Originals required. No copies accepted.
 - All purebred barrows must be ear notched. Registration papers will be checked with ear notches of animals before animals can be weighed.
- This is a partially terminal show (grand and reserve overall will be terminal)
- All barrows will declare weight
- TICKETING AND PARKING INFORMATION - There will be no admission charge in 2021. Parking will be charged. The cost for parking is \$50 for 6 days and \$75 for the full run of the event. There is no pre-purchase available for parking.

SESSION 3 JUNIOR MARKET BARROW OWNERSHIP

All animals exhibited must have been completely and fully owned (as evidenced by a bill of sale or registration papers) including all showing rights, and in the complete possession and continual care of the exhibitor **on and after May 26** or county designated date, whichever comes first.

- Ownership will be considered lost if the animal has been consigned or sold to another person through an auction or any other type transaction, even if the exhibitor “buys back” his animal.
- *JUNIOR EXHIBITORS MUST SHOW THEIR OWN ANIMALS.* Exceptions will be made only for exhibitors who may be physically impaired, who have two animals entered in the same class, or an exhibitor absent on show day due to other commitments. In case of these exceptions another boy or girl who is eligible to be an Ohio Junior Division Exhibitor, *MUST* be a resident of Ohio, may exhibit the animal with the authorization of the Department Director. If a Junior Fair Livestock Exhibitor cannot be present at the time of judging the exhibitor will need to present to the Department Director a written permission notice signed by the football coach, band director or any other person in charge of an activity that is in conflict and prevents the exhibitor from being present at the time of judging. This notice must be on official letterhead of the organization and given to the department director 24 hours before show day and must include name, county, birthdate, home phone number, and complete address of the exhibitor's, home and work of the person in charge of the event (i.e. football coach, band director, etc.) Also include a brief description of the conflict.

SESSION 3 JUNIOR MARKET BARROW WEIGHTS & WEIGH IN

- All barrow weights must be declared within 2 hours of check-in or no later than 9 PM. Barrows must weigh between 220 and 280, declared.
- Only barrows meeting weight requirements will be eligible for showing in the Junior Division classes (including all showmanship classes).
- A declaration of weight must be declared in the swine office within 2 hours of the check-in OR by 9 PM if arrival is after 5 PM. All declared weights and official weights must be within the 220-280 limits.
- The top barrows in each weight class will be re- weighed and any barrow weighing 15 pounds over or under the declared weight will be automatically disqualified from the show.
- All weigh backs during the show will be plus or minus 15 pounds of the show weight.
- All barrow classes will be divided after weigh-in with 12 head per class, with plus or minus 5 head for breed/ class breakdown.

SESSION 3 JUNIOR MARKET BARROW TERMINAL SHOW AND SALE

- GRAND AND RESERVE OVERALL BARROWS ARE TERMINAL. All other barrows will be released for the exhibitor to take home after the show.
- Exhibitors are responsible for the health and protection of their barrows. All barrows(except Grand and Reserve Breed Champions) will be released on Friday, August 6 after the conclusion of the show. All Grand and Reserve Breed Champions not selected for the Overall Grand and Reserve Champion will be released at the conclusion of the Grand Drive on Saturday, August 7. The Junior Fair Grand Champion Barrow and Reserve Grand Champion Barrow must sell in the Sale of Champions on Sunday, August 8.
- All animals may be tested for Ractopamine. Our show is ractopamine free.

SESSION 3 JUNIOR MARKET BARROW PENNING REQUIREMENTS AND ASSIGNMENTS

- Pens purchased through the Buckeye Barrow Boosters Sale at 2019 Fair must have penning assignments submitted by July 1st or pens are forfeited. Penning information can be emailed to Angie Barney at osfswine@gmail.com. Pens must meet penning requirements or pens will be forfeited.

Penning is based on following exhibited entries per exhibitor:

1 Pig = 1 Pen; 2 Pigs = 1 Pen
 3 Pigs = 2 Pens; 4 Pigs = 2 Pens
 5 Pigs = 3 Pens; 6 Pigs = 3 Pens

- Pen assignments request will be taken on Sunday, July 25th. Tickets for your spot in line can be picked up beginning at 8 am on Sunday, July 25th at the Ohio State Fair Swine Barn Office. **NO BARN LINES. We are working on an online system, if available prior to the fair, information will be sent to all exhibitors via email used in online entry.**
- All pens are assigned by the Swine Department personnel. Exhibitors must check in upon arrival with animals for correct pen assignments before bedding down. Exhibits incorrectly located will need to move to assigned area. If exhibitor fails to follow pen assignments, they will be asked to leave.
- Pen space limited to pigs only. NO TACK or FEED in pens. Boards may be put across the top of pens for tack and feed storage. Pens are approximately 5' x 7'.
- All fans and cords MUST be inspected by a fair official in the Swine Department before being plugged in. Only three (3) plug prong fans will be accepted. When your fans and cords have been certified to be free of defects they will be sealed with a band allowing them to be used. Any fan, or cord found in the swine barn without the inspectors band will have to be removed.

SESSION 3 JUNIOR MARKET BARROWS CLASS BREAKDOWN PROCEDURE

- The total number of classes offered in this show per breed may vary depending upon the total number of barrows shown in the breed.
- Classes will be equalized as evenly as possible after weighing at the discretion of Fair Management.
- Individual registration papers for purebreds are mandatory at check-in. Purebred registration information is required to be entered at time of entry.
- Crossbred barrows will be divided into dark (showing color pigmentation on skin) or other (showing no red or black pigmentation on skin) divisions. These divisions will be considered as breed classes and awarded equally.
- Any breed failing to exhibit a total of 15 animals in the market classes will be cause for evaluation of continuing this breed in future shows.

SESSION 3 JUNIOR MARKET BARROWS GROOMING REQUIREMENTS

- **Only water may be used**, any oil or what appears to be oil or powder will not be permitted.
- All barrows must have a measurable 1/2" of body hair, underline included. Ears and tail may be a shorter length.
- Top placing animals will be checked for hair length at re-weigh. Any other barrow may be checked during the exhibition. All hogs in violation will be disqualified. Lower placing animals meeting requirements will replace these animals in placing order.

SESSION 3 JUNIOR MARKET BARROW AWARDS

- Junior Barrow Premiums will be determined at the conclusion of the show.
- Animals in each class will be placed on a 1-2-3-4 etc. basis and the premiums as listed will be paid on the numerical placing.

SALE OF CHAMPIONS

- Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Barrows will sell in the Sale of Champions, on Sunday, August 8, 2:00 pm
 - The animals sold in the 2021 Ohio State Fair Sale of Champions will have a top dollar cap as follows:
 - Grand Champion Barrow - \$10,000
 - Reserve Grand Champion Barrow - \$7,000
- Twenty-five percent (25%), or amount over cap listed above, whichever is greater, will be distributed among other youth exhibitors. These funds will go to scholarships, Outstanding Market Exhibitor Program, Outstanding Breeding Exhibitor, showmanship, skillathons, dairy cattle, breeding livestock, FFA, 4-H, Ohio State Fair Band and Choir, and endowments.

OUTSTANDING BARROW EXHIBITOR PROGRAM

- Youth Reserve Program awards will be announced at a later date.
- Fourth through thirty places in the Outstanding Market Exhibitor will be sponsored by the Ohio Swine Youth Committee.

The non-profit Ohio Swine Youth Committee is a support group for swine shows at the Ohio State Fair. Proceeds are generated from sponsorships of swine shows, the Ohio Crossbred Classic, and the Ohio Youth Gilt Show.

BUCKEYE BARROW BOOSTER BREED CHAMPION SCHOLARSHIP PRESENTATIONS

- The Buckeye Barrow Booster Breed Champion Scholarships will be handled in the following manner. Ten (10) Division Champions and ten (10) Reserve Champions will be competing to be the overall Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Barrows. The remaining champion barrows will be presented scholarships from the Buckeye Barrow Boosters.

- Breed Champions and Reserve Breed Champions will be subject to a blood test to determine if any altering substance has been used as well as Ractopamine testing.

DIVISION 511 BARROW SHOW- NO LATE ENTRY

ALL barrows MUST enter into Division 511. This year you will be entering into specific classes by Breed. Other information that will need provided is the 840 Tag ID#, ear notch, Sire, Sire of the Dam, registration number if purebred, and declaring/acknowledging your barrow had been and will be ractopamine free. Barrows have a limit of SIX head to be entered at a rate of \$25 per head (entered into appropriate classes), You may also enter THREE substitution barrows at no additional charge (these 3 will be entered into class 002), each of them need to be entered into their respective breed classes.
