

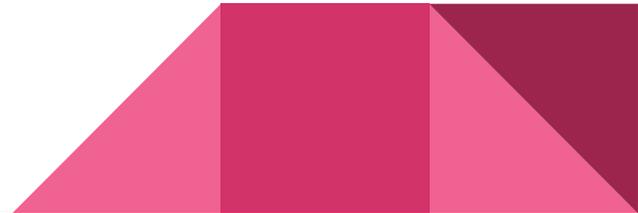
Important Dates

- **Project Drop-Off Day:** Thursday, July 23 from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. or Friday, July 24 from 8:00 to 9:30 a.m.
- **Check-in Day for judging:** Friday, July 24 starting at 10:00 a.m.



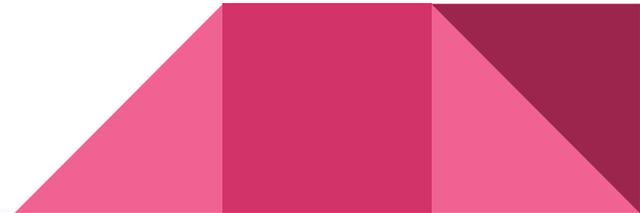
How The Day Runs

- When the exhibitor arrives at the building they need to check-in to the front desk at least 15 minutes before their scheduled time to be judged.
- When called upon, the exhibitor goes up to the workbench and makes a small woodworking project that will be timed.
- After they finished their project, they will be brought to one of the judges tables by one of the Junior Fair Board members.
- During that process the judge will go over the exhibitor's completed book, the project made that day, and the project brought to the fair.
- After all the exhibitors in that class have been to the judges table, they will announce a winner for that class to compete at the state level



How To Show Your Project

- After the judge is done looking at your book and the project that you made during the show, you will both head over to look over the project that you brought to the show.
- You will need to explain to the judge the process of the whole project in detail about everything that happened along the way. He will also very well ask you “what you learned from the project” and “something that you could’ve done better”.
 - Tell the story behind your project and how it was made



Things To Remember

- When you drop off your project, it is always a good idea to wipe down your project, so that there is no dust on it and it doesn't look dirty when you have your interview.
- It is always super important to make a good first impression with the judge, so always make sure you shake their hand when you go to the table.
- Always answer the questions very confidently and don't forget to say Thank You after you're done with your interview with the judge.
